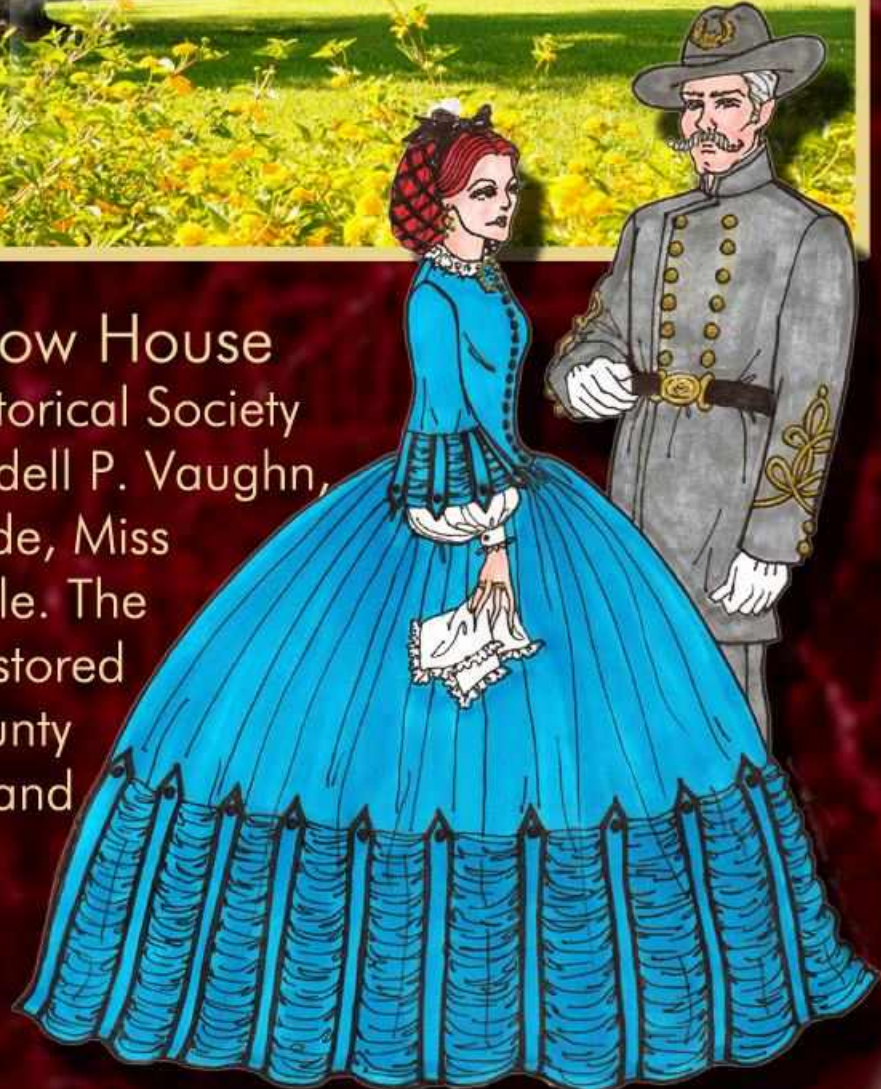
Saint Stephen's Episcopal Church - Circa 1914

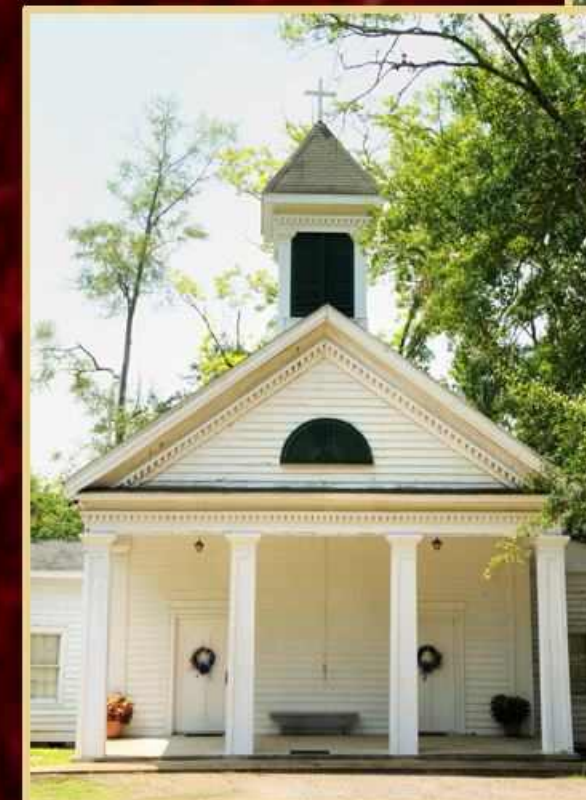

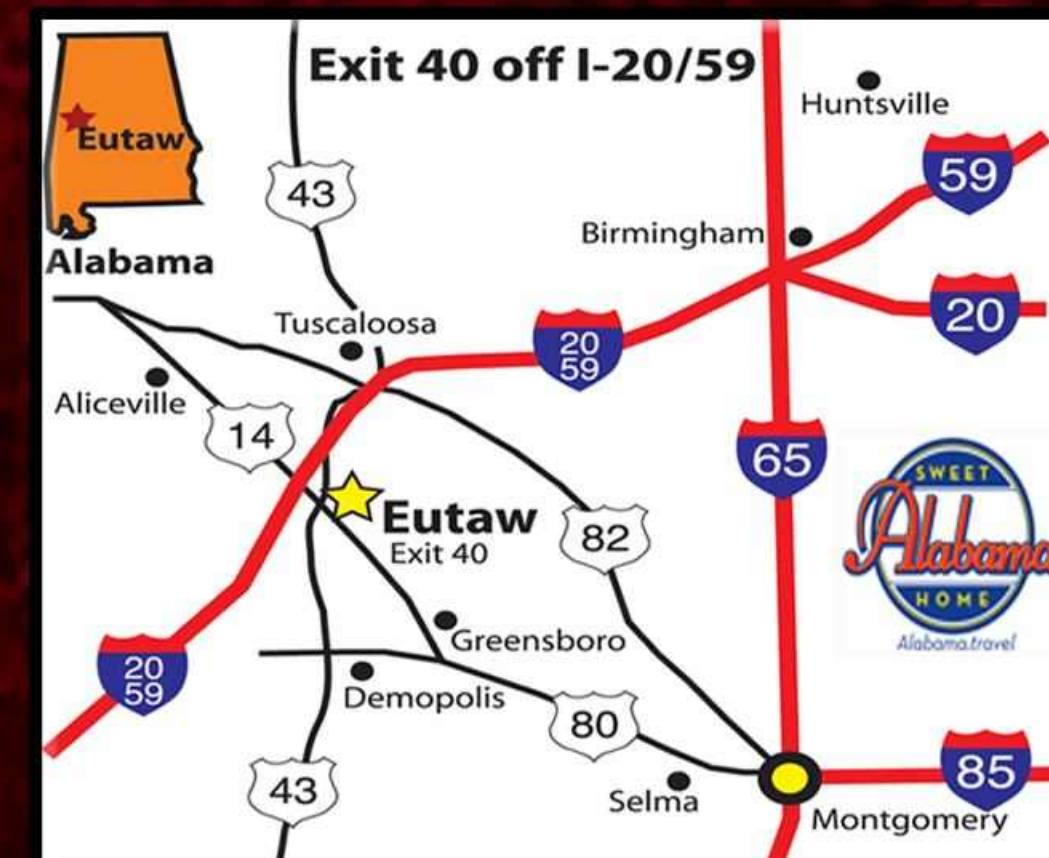

MYRTLE HALL

Perched atop the highest hill in Greene County, sits Myrtle Hall, originally known as Boligee Hill, Myrtle Hall with it's three stories, is reminiscent of the raised cottage style popular in the low country of South Carolina, the birthplace of it's builder, Dr. David Means. William Perkins, a wealthy merchant from Kentucky, built this three story Greek Revival home in 1850. The house has double parlours, divided by double doors & beautiful Millwork throughout.

Kirkwood Mansion, home of cotton broker Foster Mark Kirksey, is one of the most architecturally significant, and most photographed antebellum homes in the south.
